## President's Message

Dear Members,

There is a hamburger shop known as Fergburger in Queenstown, New Zealand, which lays claim to having the best hamburger in the world. Queenstown is a small town with a population of 2500, and yet this little takeaway place has claimed the best hamburger in the world! I would attest to the fact that they do serve a great tasting hamburger. It seems that many others agree too, judging from the long queues at the counter and the packed seating. The lamb and beef burgers, with fancy names like Tropical Swine, Fergburger and Little Lamby, all taste great. The beetroot is sweeter, the vegetables fresh and generous and the pineapple juicier. Apparently, Burger King opened at the same time as Fergburger, but did not survive the competition. Fergburger is a self-service place, yet somehow the tables are always cleared and ready for the next customer – (because the customers clear them up themselves after eating!)

There are perhaps lessons to be drawn for our Club. No, I am not suggesting that you all have to clear your own tables! But sadly, Food and Beverage at our Club adheres to the reverse (=20:80) Pareto rule. F & B draws 80% of the attention (mainly complaints) although it generates perhaps less than 20% of the activities in the Club. Food quality is always a subjective matter. I have some who say the food is good at the Raintree, and a similar number who complain about it. Maybe we can create a Fergburger (or 'Raintreeburger') – one uniquely good dish which would instead draw a favourable 80:20 Pareto ratio? Something that would help us to increase F & B revenue to 80%, while drawing only 20% in complaints. I guess we have to dream before our dreams come true...

A recent letter from a Member who said he only visits the Club once a year caught my attention. He was very unhappy with the service at the Kenanga Coffee House. Apparently the service was slow, the tables were not cleared and he lambasted the Club for failing to meet the high standards that he felt it promised to its Members. He was upset at the staff who had apologized profusely to him, believing that the Club is only good at apologizing.

There is perhaps a disconnect with our Asian culture, in which an apology does not really mean that we are sorry and will do better the next time. Instead, we apologize because we have made you unhappy...but the next time you come it will be the same! The correct follow-up to an apology is to take the necessary action to make changes. But we do not always do that (at the Raintree and elsewhere).

Which raises the next question: can we change? On that particular day when the Member in question complained, it happened to be busy as the Club was hosting a major tennis event with many visitors (see report in this edition). The Kenanga was packed to the brim and the staff were stretched. Perhaps one lesson to be learnt is that the

management should inform the caterer to put in more staff to cater for such big events (though this is not always easy to agree with the caterer). On the flip side, the complainant, if he is a regular at the Club, should have been more understanding, as it was clear that the Club's resources were stretched on that day.

I have always said that the Club is about its Members. The Members generate the activities, and the Club manages its facilities to provide the services that Members require. We need perhaps to ask ourselves some basic questions about this. Does a club like ours require a five-star food and beverage service? Also, do we have the revenue to support such a service (and if not, how can we generate it)? We certainly need to look at these basic directions, and the implications for the Club and its catering. The Club took the decision some years ago to outsource food and beverage. This gave us the benefit of cost control, but it meant that we lost direct control of the quality of service. Was that – even more important, is it still – the right decision?

The Club has been at a crossroads for a long time. The Members need to decide what kind of F & B they need. Just as the KL cityscape has changed dramatically, with old landmark hotels being knocked down and rebuilt to keep in step with the times, so our Club too needs to reassess its strategic direction. The General Committee looks forward to your input as Members on this at the next General Meeting.

Let me end with a story. The other day I was watching a big ship dock in port. Two small tugboats, dwarfed by the big ship, were pushing and pulling, and then pushing some more until the big ship was maneuvered into position at the wharf. If the Raintree is the big ship that needs to turn around to arrive at its destination, it needs Members to be pushing and pulling to get it there. It is not about visiting the Club once a year and making a critical comment. As a Member, your input has to be considered and continuous, so that the General Committee can execute policy consistent with what Members want. This is in the end a Members' club; so as I always say, it needs Members' participation if changes for the good are to be made. Your ideal opportunity for all this is at the Annual General Meeting. I look forward seeing all of you at the next one.

## Terrific Tigers Triumph in Titanic Tennis Tournament Tussle!

It was Friday the 11th of May. The teams were gathering for the biggest event on Raintree's tennis calendar - indeed, one of the biggest events on the Club's calendar: the annual Raintree Tennis Invitational Tournament. Formerly known as the 'Masters', this tournament brings together teams from far and wide to compete in what is the longest running inter-club competition in Malaysia.

This year was no exception, with a strong entry list of 13 teams from 11 clubs (the Raintree and Japan Club each put in two teams). Teams came from far and wide in Peninsular Malaysia, from Johor in the south to Taiping and Penang in the north. We were also delighted to welcome back our neighbours from southern Thailand, Trang, who came with a strong team for the third year in a row.

And so to the competition. The Raintree Tigers were reigning champions, having won the event every year so far. But they faced a difficult challenge: could they pull it off again even without some of their strongest players (Wilson Khoo and Terence Chia, not to mention Pang Tse Shing, who had to withdraw at the last minute due to illness)?

In the event, it turned out to be a cliffhanger. The Tigers sailed effortlessly through their two group matches, winning both 5-0. But a nasty shock awaited them in the quarter finals. Their long-standing rivals, Lake View Club, surprisingly lost 3-2 in the group stages to a strong team from Penang Sports Club. The Raintree Tigers therefore faced Lake View in the quarters on Saturday 12th - and

they did so without their ex-international star Suresh Menon, who was due to join the team only on the Sunday.

The match began badly, with both our 30s and 40s doubles pairs losing to strong Lake View opponents. The Tigers were 2-0 down. Our reliable 60s pairing (John Los Santos/K M Tan) then pulled one back. Next up were our strong ladies pair of Lisbeth Recter and Gaby Los Santos. Despite a few wobbles, they squeezed through 8-6. So it all came down to the last, deciding match: the 50s. This pitted our coach and captain Selvarajoo and Melvin Song against the strongest Lake View pairing of Marco Winter and Andy Kee. Even the normally ebullient Rajoo was subdued going into the match. After all, he had never won against Marco Winter in the Raintree tournament! However, Melvin and Rajoo played brilliantly, breaking Andy Kee's service twice to pull out a deserved 8-4 victory. The Tigers were through to the semis!

But the drama was not over. Despite their best efforts, neither our 30s (Mark Yeo/Shane Lai/Khor Chih Wei) nor 40s (Terry Wong/Gordon Reid) pairings could muster a single point against an excellent Taiping team in the semis, or an even better Trang team in the final. In both matches the Tigers therefore faced another 2-0 deficit. But on both occasions our ladies (Lisbeth/Gaby), 60s (Melvin Song/John Los Santos) and 50s pairings (Rajoo/Suresh Menon) pulled out wins to give the Raintree 3-2 victories.....and the championship again!

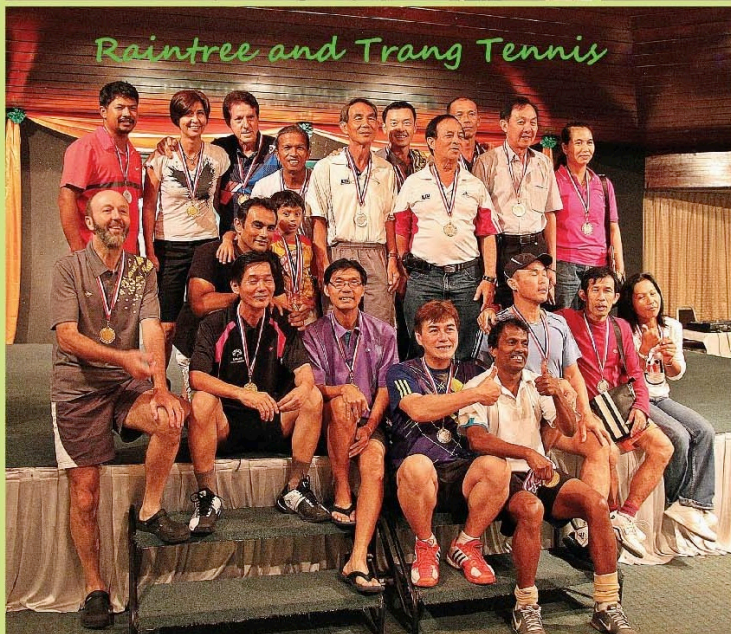
